



and start their study life in Hong Kong and to assist them in overcoming difficulties they may encounter, the College provides a series of tailor-made activities for them.

An orientation programme for new Mainland students is held before semester commencement every year. Topics which echo the needs of Mainland students such as college adjustment, college study skills, English learning in sub-degree programme, Cantonese in daily life, are introduced through interactive activities like games, group discussions, etc. A campus tour and community walk are also organised to facilitate their understanding of the campus life and living environment in Hong Kong.

The College also provides a comprehensive service and support to our Mainland students throughout the year. Support group meetings with different topics on college study and further studies are held regularly to facilitate students' college adjustment and future planning. Successful graduates are also invited to share with their fellow students. Topics of support group meetings include: (i) group project presentation skills, (ii) information on local and overseas study opportunities, (iii) tips on applying to universities, (iv) tips on exam preparation, (v) managing stress and preparing for exams, etc.

Social activities and gatherings are organised in each semester to help them extend their social network for mutual support. Varieties of joy-related pleasurable





activities enable a relaxing and chill atmosphere for students getting to know each other and building up peer relationships, such as barbequeing and visiting Hong Kong scenic places. We also have gatherings in Lunar New Year to send blessings to each other and enjoy "Poon Choi" (a traditional Cantonese festival meal composed of many layers of different ingredients). Some trendy activities for youth like "Running Man" game, etc. were also held.







The Peer Advisors Scheme is a supportive service for Mainland freshmen to facilitate their adaptation of College life and living environment in Hong Kong. Trained Peer Advisors will offer guidance and support through organising diverse activities and giving assistance to build a mutual network for fellow Mainland students.

Peer Advisors also provide individual consultation to newcomers by sharing their experiences and

resources as well as offering guidance during their adaptation to college study and the new environment in Hong Kong. Additionally, Peer Advisors keep close contact with Year 1 students via social media to relay important messages, activities organised by SDCS and useful resources in order to strengthen the linkage between the College and Mainland students.




Figures of Student Articulation



I am grateful for all the support and encouragement I received while studying at the College. It was undoubtedly a springboard to my university studies and my marketing career.


